Embark on a captivating 7-day journey through the heart of New Mexico's most unique landscapes and cultural treasures. Walk amongst the glistening white gypsum dunes at White Sands National Park and descend into the massive yet delicate caves at Carlsbad Caverns National Park. Experience the distinctive wine and colonial charm of Historic Old Mesilla while in Las Cruces. Explore the mysteries surrounding close encounters in Roswell. And discover ancient cultures, world famous Southwestern cuisine and renowned museums in Albuquerque on this true exploration of the "Land of Enchantment" – from the underground to the sky.

Day 1 - Welcome to New Mexico! (Tues., April 14)

Optional transfers from our departure points will have us at LAX this morning for a scheduled nonstop flight arriving in El Paso, Texas late this afternoon. Those guests making their own flight arrangements can request the group's flight schedule (subject to change) to coordinate a flight arrival time that would allow them to be included on the complimentary transfer to the hotel. Upon arrival, we'll board a deluxe motorcoach and continue north to Las Cruces, New Mexico where we'll enjoy a two-night stay. Enjoy an included dinner at La Posta de Mesilla, serving up traditional New Mexican cuisine. (Dinner)

Day 2 – Las Cruces (Wed., April 15)

This morning we'll visit New Mexico State University and experience the Chile Pepper Institute and the **Zuhl Museum**, containing over 1,800 beautiful specimens of petrified wood, fossils and minerals. Join a local guide for a short walking tour of **Historic Old Mesilla**, rich in history and timeless charm. This afternoon we'll visit a local winery and taste southern New Mexico's distinctive local blends, featuring

flavors only found in the Mesilla Valley. This evening we'll enjoy an included dinner at **Double Eagle**, the crown jewel of Historic Old Mesilla. (Breakfast, Dinner)

Day 3 - White Sands, Space & Pistachios (Thurs., April 16)

This morning we'll travel east into southern New Mexico's Tularosa Basin and White Sands National Park. We'll travel along the scenic Dunes Drive, which takes us into the heart of the world's largest gypsum dune field, where great wave-like dunes of gypsum crystals have engulfed 275 square miles of desert! Enjoy an included boxed lunch picnic and a leisurely stroll along the fully accessible and elevated Interdune Boardwalk, providing the easiest way to get out into the middle of this fragile and unique ecosystem. This afternoon we'll visit the New Mexico Museum of Space History, a Smithsonian Affiliate that celebrates the history, science and technology of space exploration, focusing on New Mexico's crucial role in America's space program. Later, we'll visit New Mexico's first and largest pistachio grove for a behind-the-scenes tour of a working pistachio farm. This evening we'll enjoy an overnight stay at the AAA Four Diamond Inn of the Mountain Gods, a premier mountain resort nestled amongst the picturesque Sacramento Mountains at 7,200 feet above sea level. Enjoy luxurious accommodations, multiple dining options and a Las Vegas-style casino. (Breakfast, Lunch)

Day 4 - Roswell (Friday, April 17)

After a late check out, we'll travel east this morning to **Roswell**, the quirky, alien-themed city known around the world as the location of a UFO "incident," in 1947. We'll visit the **International UFO Museum** which focuses on the "The Roswell UFO Incident" and what led many to believe the ensuing government cover-up. The museum features a variety of displays, including graphic representations of the crash debris, models of aliens, and mock-ups of alleged events, such as the famous alien autopsy scene. After an included lunch at a locals' favorite and a sweet treat from one of Roswell's most iconic sites, we'll begin a two-night stay in Roswell. (Breakfast, Lunch)

Day 5 - Carlsbad Caverns National Park (Sat., April 18)

This morning we'll travel south to **Carlsbad Caverns National Park**, perhaps the most famous and spectacular cave systems in the world! This UNESCO World Heritage Site beneath the Chihuahuan Desert was formed when sulfuric acid dissolved the surrounding limestone, creating huge, deep passages, up to 250 feet high! We'll have several hours at leisure to explore the Visitor Center, enjoy lunch on your own at the cafeteria and embark on a self-guided tour of the "Big Room." You may choose to descend the steep, 1 ¼ mile paved trail through the cavern's Natural Entrance and exit via an elevator. Or, simply ride the elevator 750 feet down to the "Big Room" and exit via the elevator as well. Either way, you'll have the opportunity to explore the "Big Room," the largest single cave chamber (by volume) in North America via the paved Big Room Trail (1 ¼ miles or ½ mile if you take the shortcut). This massive, eight-acre chamber has a 255-foot ceiling that is filled with spectacularly beautiful and delicate formations as well as huge columns, stalactites and stalagmites. We'll return to the hotel late this afternoon with the evening at leisure. (Breakfast)

Day 6 - Albuquerque (Sunday, April 19)

This morning we'll travel north to Albuquerque and enjoy time at leisure for browsing and lunch on own in historic **Old Town Albuquerque**. A visit to the beautiful **San Felipe de Neri Church** provides a deep connection to the city's Spanish colonial roots as well as a peaceful, historic counterpoint to the bustling shops, galleries and eateries in the Old Town Plaza. Later, we'll visit the **Indian Pueblo Cultural Center**, the world-class museum collectively owned by the 19 Puebloan Indian Tribes of New Mexico. Enjoy time at leisure to browse the center which tells the story of the Pueblo peoples' legacy, resilience, and history through their own voices, words, artistry, artifacts and traditional Native American dance. This evening we'll enjoy an included dinner at a locals' favorite. (Breakfast, Dinner)

Day 7 – Albuquerque, Journey Home (Monday, April 20)

This morning we'll step aboard the **Sandia Peak Tramway** – for a 2.7-mile journey to the summit of Sandia Crest (elevation 10,378). Enjoy time at leisure at the summit to explore and (weather permitting) take in the spectacular panoramic views. After an included lunch at a beloved New Mexican institution known for its quirky environment and "ordinary food done extraordinary well," we'll visit the **National Museum of Nuclear Science & History**. This Smithsonian Affiliate provides a comprehensive and thought provoking look at the story of the Atomic Age with exhibits focused on the Manhattan Project, the Cold War, pioneers of the atom, and the diverse non-military uses of nuclear technology. Late this afternoon we'll arrive at the Albuquerque International Sunport for our scheduled nonstop return flight to Los Angeles. *Those guests making their own flight arrangements can request the group's flight schedule (subject to change) to coordinate a flight departure time that would allow them to be included on the complimentary transfer to the airport.* Back in Los Angeles, those guests with pre-arranged transfers will be returned to their respective drop-offs. (Breakfast, Lunch)
